Supported by the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints, FamilySearch is the largest genealogy organization worldwide with over 4,000 family history centers worldwide, including the well-known Family History Library in Salt Lake City, Utah.

This is most useful to scan a Parish Register going back to the first page of the Register, first page of a year etc. I have used it to find siblings for an individual that I have found in Ireland, Catholic Parish Registers.

<u>John Grenham;s List of Major Irish Records Sources</u> - https://www.johngrenham.com/browse/ John describes it as an <u>Overview of the records</u>: i.e., <u>County-by-county listings; Interactive Maps; The Irish Abroad; Addresses; Blogs and articles; and <u>Irish genealogy links</u>. I describe it as an amazing portal. It includes a fantastic inventory of links. I especially like his maps.</u>

<u>FreeGenData.com</u> freegendata.com - A search tool to help you locate free genealogy databases and record transcriptions on the web. For Ireland there were 992 links and for Galway, Ireland, there were 35 web site links.

<u>Tithe Applotment Books 1823 - 1837</u> http://search.ancestrylibrary.com/search/db.aspx?dbid=1270 - They were compiled to determine the amount which occupiers of agricultural holdings over one acre should pay in tithes to the Church of Ireland (the main Protestant church and the church established by the State until its dis-establishment in 1871.

Census of Ireland 1901/1911 http://www.census.nationalarchives.ie/ - All 32 Counties are covered.

Ask About Ireland and The Irish Cultural Project http://www.askaboutireland.ie/ - Ask About Ireland and the Cultural Heritage Project is an initiative of public libraries together with local museums and archives in the digitization and online publication of the original, the unusual and the unique material from their local studies' collections to create a national Internet resource for culture. The participating organizations have selected material of particular public interest from their holdings within a variety of common topics ranging from sport, transport and architecture to flora and fauna and Irish writers. The material is then digitized (scanned, digitally photographed, recorded etc.) and set in a narrative context. A number of County Libraries have included AskAboutIrelend.ie on their web sites. The current version includes Irish Times newspaper articles back to 1859. Also included is an alphabetical list of names in each directory.

Phase two - to link the will calendar entries to the digitized images of the wills - will follow shortly.

Pigot's Commercial Directory of Ireland, 1824 http://www.failteromhat.com/pigot.php - This is one of earliest full commercial directories of Ireland, and includes over 220 urban centers throughout the island. Organized by Province, and then town, it lists all the principal office holders, gentry, professionals, tradesmen, hotels, schools, public institutions, churches, and even pubs for each town in Ireland. There is a description of each Province and town as well. This was Pigot's much-expanded second edition (the previous version dated 1820) and is now extremely rare. The collection is organized into four sections, by province, with additional details for Dublin: Leinster & Dublin, Connaught, Munster and Ulster.

Slater's Commercial Directory of Ireland, 1846 http://www.failteromhat.com/slaterm.htm -\_This superb book includes a full commercial directory for the entire country. Organized by Province, and then town, it lists all the principal office holders, gentry, professionals, trades, hotels, schools, public institutions, churches, and even pubs for each town in Ireland. Slater took over Pigot's important publication of commercial directories of Ireland, and this was the first installment. It has almost twice as much detail as its predecessor (published in 1824), and is now an extremely rare item. The book is organized into four sections, by province, with additional details for the four main cities: Leinster & Dublin, Connaught, Munster, Cork & Limerick and Ulster & Belfast.

Boston Pilot Advertisements http://infowanted.bc.edu/ - From October 1831 through October 1921, the Boston Pilot newspaper printed a "Missing Friends" column with advertisements from people looking for "lost" friends and relatives who had emigrated from Ireland to the United States. This extraordinary collection of 41,249 records is available here as a searchable online database, which contains a text record for each ad that appeared in the Boston Pilot.

#### Free Canada Sites

Automated Census of Canada http://automatedgenealogy.com/ - The Automated Genealogy site hosts several projects to index Canadian censuses. Over the last several years Library and Archives Canada (LAC) has digitized their microfilms of the original census forms for several of the Canadian censuses. The Automated Genealogy project group has organized volunteers to produce indices to the people enumerated in these censuses. Each project uses simple web forms to allow volunteers to transcribe census data from the images into a database, with the entered data being immediately available on the site. Following transcription, volunteers proofread and make corrections. Anyone with an internet connection can participate as a transcriber, proofreader, or just by submitting corrections as they use the site. The status of each census project varies depending on how long it has been active. There is a link to the LAC image of the original census page at the top of each transcribed census page. Finally, the user can request given name changes. Surname changes are not accepted. There is an audit trail to the original version of the automated record.

### 1901 Census

The 1901 Census was the first census that LAC released images for and the first one we indexed. Transcription has been completed and we are almost 70% through proofreading.

### **1911 Census**

Transcription is now complete, proofreading is in progress.

#### **1851 Census**

Censuses were planned for 1851 for the then separate colonies of Canada (current day Ontario and Quebec), New Brunswick, and Nova Scotia. The census of Canada was delayed until early 1852 so it is variously referred to as the 1851 or 1852 Census. Indexing of the 1852 census was started in August 2007. Indexing of the 1851 Census of New Brunswick was started in June 2007 and has been completed. Indexing of the 1851 Census of Nova Scotia, which is a head-of-household-only census, has not yet begun.

I have gathered a lot of records from the site. It is updated frequently and is searchable. I am amazed at the lists of Church records, business directories, planters lists and cemetery records. There are indices for the Newfoundland Regiment in WW I and WW II. There is also a World War II Index of all Newfoundlanders who served.

I have my Pedigree Chart in it with the hope that I will find relatives who are also looking for a connection. Once I found a record for a relative, I used WikiTree to contact the individual without success.

Ancestry Library - There is no hyperlink because I use my local library to access the database. In addition, I have counted over 40 other Massachusetts communities' libraries which offer Ancestry Library. Ancestry Library is free to all library users. It is not available 24/7. It is available on-site at the library during normal working hours. I use it to search US and Canadian Censuses, US Immigration, US Naturalizations, US Border Crossings etc. In addition, I read Ancestry Library Public Trees and occasionally I cautiously gather vitals from them. When I gather records and before I add them, I attempt to validate the information. Too often people who contribute make an error and it is picked as valid by others. Join any Massachusetts library with Ancestry Library for researching its collections for \$1.

StonePics - Cemeteries of Newfoundland http://www.stonepics.com/ - StonePics is a project to photograph and index every cemetery, headstone, and monument in Newfoundland. The completion of this project makes Newfoundland the first state or province in North America to have a comprehensive database for finding cemeteries and headstones. About a quarter of a million people and 1,700 cemeteries are included. The index is free and downloadable. The index contains the Town Code and the Cemetery Code. The Index for example contains over 450 records for Tobin headstones in Newfoundland and Labrador. (My mother's Maiden Name was Tobin – her Northern Bay, Newfoundland ancestors were from Gowran, Kilkenny, Ireland.) To see the photo of a gravestone, the user must buy a CD for the town and cemetery.
