There are a couple of new features in FamilySearch.org that CBGHA members may find useful.

FamilySearch.org http://www.familysearch.org/: The web site has been redesigned to allow non-Mormons to see more. First, non-Mormons must register to see the "stuff". The new features include a Family Tree/Search feature that I have been using extensively for researching my wife Ellen's Galway families (Connolly, Conneely, and Nee). I need to look at her Geoghegan and Malley (Melia) Galway families. I have not even looked at her Cork or Waterford families yet. The data is principally from Pedigree Charts entered by Mormon Church members. I also will check my parents families who came to Newfoundland and Nova Scotia in the 18th and 19th Centuries. (I did check Petrie and was interested to find Xavier MacGillivray's date submitted by a cousin with Cape Breton misspelled.)

FamilySearch Collections List https://www.familysearch.org/search/collection/list/: The Collections List allows the user to see the collections that have been added and whether images are available. I looked at the 7 Irish collections for Ellen's families with great results.
